**NOTE:** We highly recommend using a removable strength thread lock product such as Loctite® on the bolts when installing your mounting bracket.

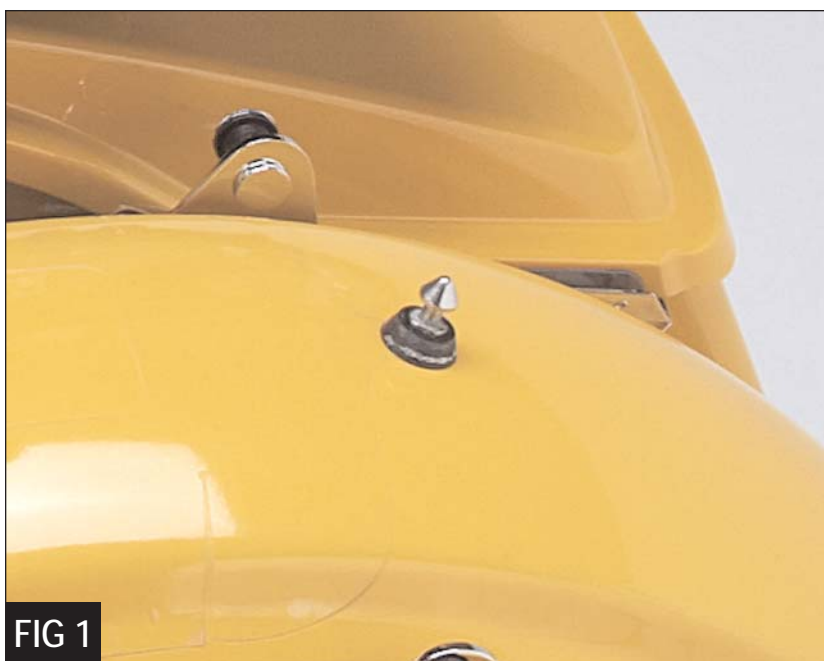
1. Start by removing the stock seat from your motorcycle providing access to the mounting area for your new saddle. Refer to your owner's manual if necessary.

2. Your new Corbin saddle installs a bit different than your stock seat in order to use a new key-lock system. Latch pin installation is a one-time deal, then your new saddle will go on and off with the included keys.

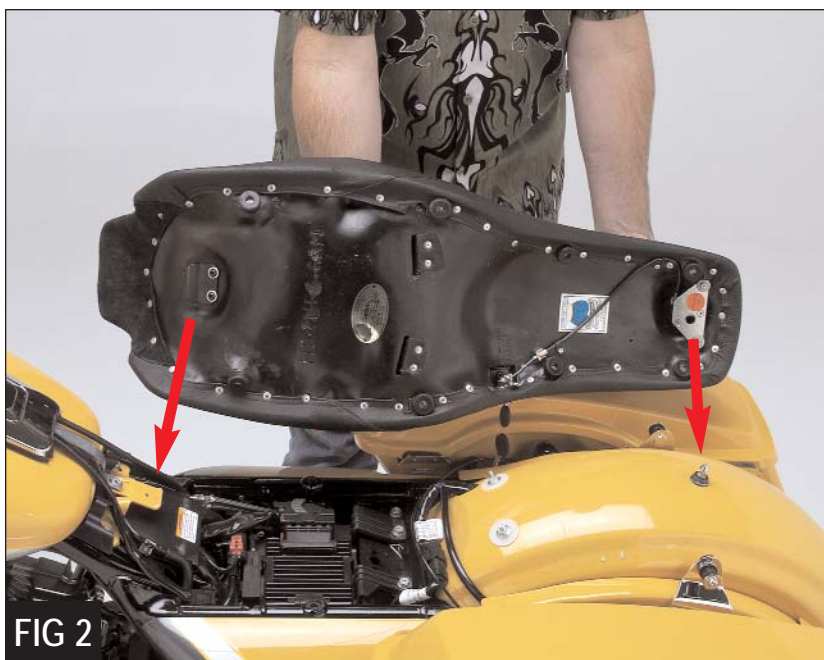
3. install the supplied #P10114 latch pin and #P00545 nylon cap into the rear thread nut of the rear fender (*Figure 1*).

4. Your new Corbin saddle is now ready to install by slipping the front tab into the slot by the rear of the gas tank, centering the seat over the mounting pin (*Figure 2*) and with a gentle push downward, your saddle will lock into place.

**NOTE:** If your saddle does not latch, it's due to the rubber grommets needing time to break in. To latch your saddle, adjust the latch pin with one or two washers.
